What will our Sessions Involve?

Our education sessions focus on sexually transmissible infections (STIs), blood borne viruses (BBVs), healthy and respectful relationships, consent, gender equity, sexual health, contraception and cultural understanding.

We work with communities to understand and reduce the harms associated with drug use.

We deliver information in a culturally responsive way that aims to decrease stigma and discrimination.

Our Standard Sessions are 1.5 to 3 hours long:

- Living well with hepatitis B
- Hepatitis C prevention and cure
- Managing and preventing HIV
- Sexual health and contraception
- Healthy relationships and consent
- Body changes and hygiene
- Alcohol and other drugs
- Stigma and discrimination

1. Join the Multicultural Sexual Health Network (MSHN)
