What do our sessions involve?

At CEH we aim to address the poorer health outcomes experienced by people from refugee and migrant backgrounds, as well as international students, around HIV, blood borne viruses (BBVs), viral hepatitis & sexually transmissible infections (STIs)

Our education sessions also focus on healthy and respectful relationships, consent, gender equity, contraception and cultural understanding.

We also work with communities to understand and reduce the harms associated with drug use. We deliver information in a culturally responsive way that aims to decrease stigma and discrimination.
